
HOW TO FIND US

BY BUS OR BY FOOT

The Lanyon Building is serviced by Metro bus routes 8A, 8B, 8C & 8D. All depart from Howard Street beside City Hall and run via Great Victoria Street (Europa Bus Centre) and Bradbury Place before reaching University Road. The bus stop is directly outside the main University grounds.

The Europa Bus Centre provides outgoing links across Northern Ireland, as well as airport coaches and routes to Dublin and beyond. It is only a 20-minute walk from the main campus. If going by foot, as you exit the bus station through The Great Northern Mall, head right along Great Victoria Street, continue straight through Shaftesbury Square and Bradbury Place. Take a slight left onto University Road, passing the Crescent Arts Centre. The Lanyon Building is on the left-hand side.

If making your way from the City Centre, head up Bedford Street and keep straight onto Dublin Road. Pass through Shaftesbury Square and Bradbury place before taking a slight left onto University Road. After passing Tesco Express and the Seamus Heaney Centre, the Lanyon Building will be on the left-hand side.

BY TRAIN

The nearest train station is Botanic Train Station located a short 5-minute walk from the main campus. Upon exiting the station turn left and proceed along Botanic Avenue. As you reach the Union Theological College on the left, turn right along University Square. The main campus is on the left.

BY BIKE

Belfast Bikes for hire are located at numerous stations around the city. The nearest docking stations on campus are located directly opposite the Lanyon Building and in front of the McClay Library to the back of the campus. Multiple bike lock stations are located on campus.

PARKING

Parking is available on the main site at evenings and weekends and on weekdays for event organisers by prior arrangement, depending on availability. Free parking is possible at Riddel Hall, subject to availability.

FINDING THE NAUGHTON GALLERY

The Naughton Gallery is located in the south side of the Lanyon Building. Enter the Lanyon Building through the main front entrance. Immediately upon entering, pass through the automatic glass doors on the left, before taking the stairs that appear on the right. Once at the top of the stairs, pass through two sets of double doors on your left, before taking a final left and entering into the gallery.



If you have accessibility requirements, a lift is available from the Welcome Centre, which is located inside the automatic glass doors on the ground floor. A member of the Welcome Centre team will be able to direct you and a member of the Naughton Gallery team will be able to greet you at the lift on the first floor before offering directions and assistance to the gallery.

WIFI

Visitors to the University can connect via QUB Guest Wifi.

NURSING MOTHERS' ROOMS AND BREASTFEEDING FACILITIES

Visitors to Queen's are welcome to avail of a range of private Nursing Mothers' Rooms for expressing milk.

All Nursing Mothers' Rooms are private, equipped with comfortable sofas, armchairs and footstools, have access to an electrical socket for breast pump use, and are located close to bathroom facilities.

The Naughton Gallery is enrolled in the Breast Feeding Welcome Here scheme.
